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VI. Read the passage given below and answer the questions:

A contagious disease is one that can be spread from person-to-person. In some cases, contagious diseases can become an epidemic or even a pandemic. An epidemic is a sudden disease outbreak that affects a large number of people in a particular region, community, or population. In an epidemic, the number of people affected by the disease is larger than what is normally expected. A pandemic is a disease epidemic that has spread to a large group of people across a large region, multiple nations, or continents.

While a disease might be contagious, it may have different effects on different people. Whether someone develops symptoms or not, is controlled by their level of immunity, which can be active or passive.

Active immunity means one's body produces antibodies to fight off the virus or another disease-causing agent. This happens after a specific disease is introduced to the body, through previous infection or a vaccine. This immunity is usually permanent. Passive immunity means the antibodies were transferred from one person to another, like from mother to baby. Passive immunity usually lasts a few weeks to a few months.
